We assisted the mother of a 18-Month old girl with gas vouchers to get her to the pediatrician in Battle Creek. The child has been running a very high temperature and is very ill.

Impact Statements

June 2016

Recently a diabetic gentleman came into see one of our Navigator's for help with his medications. He had recently enrolled in the Marketplace, picking a plan that seemed to be the most affordable. After seeing his doctor for the first time in months, he took his prescription into the pharmacy. After arriving at the pharmacy to purchase his medications he was told his insurance plan did not cover the quantity of Insulin needed. The gentleman then called his provider's office and they directed him to CHC for additional help. After hearing his story our Navigator suspected something was not right and called his insurance company. After being bounced from person to person for 45 minutes she finally connected with a representative who explained that our client needed an override on his account to receive the quantity of Insulin needed. The customer service agent helped us to obtain the override needed and our patient was able to get his medications. Had we not called the insurance company he would have either paid for the expensive medication or went without.

May 2016

We recently assisted a 30-year old woman who is bipolar and had recently lost her job and insurance. She was in dire need of her bipolar medicine, she had only a one day supply left. She had gone to her pharmacy to see how much the medicine would cost without insurance and they told her it would be over \$1,000.00. Her only source of income will be unemployment which does not begin for a couple of weeks. She did an application for insurance through Marketplace but it would not be active for 7-10 days. We called the doctor who writes her prescriptions to see if they had any samples to get the woman through until her new insurance starts. They stated that they did not have any samples available. We then contacted the company that makes the medication to see if they could help. We explained the situation and the company was able to sponsor her medication through her pharmacy for a 14-day supply with one refill to ensure she has enough medication until her insurance starts. The is was the first time we had contacted this pharmaceutical company and we were all impressed with their willingness to help and quick response. Our help meant the world to this woman because she knew how well this medication works and was afraid to experience the side effects had she had to go with out it.

April 2016

A Bellevue client contacted us with prescription concerns. She just turned 65 on Easter and when she went to pick up her prescriptions the pharmacy told her she didn't have any insurance and that she would have to pay full price. We called her pharmacy and they told us that they could not bill her medication to Medicaid because they would not pay for it due to the fact that she now has Medicare too. We took her information over the phone and called Tammy at Larmours in Athens. We asked Tammy if she could run a dummy Rx and see if it would go through. Tammy said that she was able to run the script and the other pharmacy must access our client's information through Troop Search. We called the client's pharmacy to inform them of what we had learned and they stated that they don't have access to that program and they needed a BIN, PCN, ID, and Group number. We called Tammy back and she was able to fax all of the information needed over to us. We called the client's pharmacy with the information and they were able to run the medicine with no problems.
